Getting it right for every child: keeping parents informed

As you will be aware, the Children and Young People (Scotland) Act 2014 will put parts of the Getting it right for every child (GIRFEC) approach on a statutory footing from August 2016.

To support the legislation, we recently produced detailed guidance and are currently in the middle of a 12-week consultation, aimed primarily at gathering the views of senior officers in children's services. The consultation ends on 1 May 2015.

In the meantime, we are keen to keep parents abreast of what we are doing and to that end, we have produced a short leaflet, telling them about the consultation, inviting them to get involved if they wish and letting them know a bit more about GIRFEC and the Act.

Getting it right for every child - update

The Scottish Government is currently consulting on detailed guidance that supports parts of the Children and Young People (Scotland) Act 2014. This Act is a new law that will give children, young people and their families extra support and will encourage everyone to talk about children's wellbeing using the same words. The consultation on the guidance is due to run until 1 May. It is mainly aimed at the people who support your child – including parents' organisations – but individual parents are welcome to get involved if they wish.
